CLEAN UP AUSTRALIA DAY

Clean Up Australia Day

Clean Up Australia Day occurs annually on the first Sunday in March. March 2nd this year marked 35 years of this national event which is now the nation's largest community-based environmental event. Over 22 million Aussies have stepped up over the years, pulled on their gloves and donated their time to improve the environment.

Over time, Clean Up Australia has evolved to provide practical solutions to help all Australians live more sustainably every day of the year. This is because Australia's environmental challenges go far beyond one day. In our current climate, the focus is as much on preventing rubbish entering our environment as it is removing what has already accumulated.



Fast facts:

- Australians used 3.5 million tonnes of plastics in 2018 to 2019, 60% of which was imported plastic.
- One million tonnes of Australia's annual plastic consumption are single-use plastic.
- Australia uses approximately **70 billion pieces** of soft 'scrunchable' plastics each year.
- 130,000 tonnes of plastic leaks into the marine environment in Australia each year.
- By 2025 it is predicted that 99% of seabirds worldwide will have ingested plastic.
- By 2050, it is estimated that the plastic in the oceans will outweigh fish.
- Our use of plastic is increasing and across the world it will double by 2040.

What can YOU do?

Refuse. Reduce. Reuse. Recycle. Compost.

We make very little use of the resources we already extract when we could be feeding them back into the resource loop, preventing rubbish entering the environment and waste going to landfill.

As Australia's waste challenges continue to grow, we all need to step up and support solutions which move us towards a circular economy – where everything is a resource, and there is no such thing as waste.

Let's make every day Clean Up Australia Day!

Clean Up Australia Day - Student Article

What is Clean Up Australia Day?

Clean up Australia Day is the nation's largest community-based environmental event, held annually on the first Sunday in March. It was started 35 years ago by Ian Kiernan AO, with the goal of improving and conserving the environment by cleaning up litter. It's important because it encourages individuals and communities to take action in protecting the environment. Over the years, more than 22 million Australians have participated, helping to reduce pollution and preserve natural spaces. The event promotes environmental awareness and responsibility, making a positive impact on local communities.

How can you get involved?

The Clean Up Australia website has a variety of resources for individuals who want to get involved, including the option to register a clean-up in your community. The organisation sends free starter kits containing everything an individual, family, or group of ten would need to conduct a clean-up. For those that don't want to register, the website also has a map to view and join a registered clean up near you at any point in the year.

Leading a cleaner and more sustainable lifestyle doesn't require joining a clean-up. Instead, it can be achieved in day-to-day life by making simple choices such as using a reusable drink bottle or thrifting clothing instead of buying fast fashion. Other examples include; composting food, disposing of recyclables and ten cent refundable cans or bottles properly and even using paper straws instead of plastic can make a difference. As said by Anne Marie Bonneau, "We don't need a handful of people doing zero waste perfectly. We need millions of people doing it imperfectly."
